1. (Knowledge and Skills)

Basic academic skills required to learn specialized studies in business design

- 2. (Interest in and Motivation of societal studies)
- (1) Broad interest in today's social and business issues

(2) Positive motivation to become a person who can create value for society through their university studies

- 3. (Creativity, Thinking Ability, Judgment Ability, and Expressiveness)
- (1) Willingness to come up with new ideas and creativity
- (2) Basic skills to think logically
- (3) Ability to listen to and understand other's ideas, and make sound judgement
- (4) Ability to express their own opinions
- 4. (Positive attitude toward learning by taking initiative and collaborating with diverse people)
- (1) Ability to work proactively with diverse people, share goals, and support others
- (2) Ability to work with diverse people and persist until goals are achieved
