Contemporary Thai Society and Disparity:

Urban Social Problems and Inequalities in the Rural Farm

Sociological studies of poverty and social stratification include social welfare policy, social security payment, inequalities among generations, gender inequality, changing social networks, and the development of civil society. This lecture focuses on social disparity in Thailand as an example of the social challenges brought on by changes in the global economy and the restructuring industries.
