


INTRODUCTION

LOCATION

Momoyama Gakuin University is in Izumi City located in the south part of Osaka, an area with a good-old Japan atmosphere. Due to the numerous shrines, temples, and parks within the city, you will be able to surround yourself in a natural environment. Izumi City is about 30 minutes from Osaka downtown and Kansai International Airport. It's convenient location provides easy access to Kansai's famous locations such as Namba, Umeda, Kyoto and Nara.



International Center





- *DO NOT make loud noise late at night. In particular, parties are strictly prohibited in the building.
- *You must pay the ENTIRE AMOUNT of rent for a semester (JPY240,000) at beginning of each semester. Payment is only acceptable in CASH.
- *All exchange students will live in the International Student Dormitory. No special procedure is required to move in.
- *Utilities (Gas, Electricity, and Water) are NOT included in the rent, and tenants must pay the bills on their own.
- *Internet fee is included in your semester fees.
- *If you arrive in mid-September or mid-March, a resident assistant can pick you up at Kansai International Airport and you can move into your flat on the first day.
- *The fees and schedule in this brochure are subject to change.

Medical-care insurance	<p>In principle, all exchange students have to join Japanese National Health Insurance after arriving in Japan.</p> <p>With the Japanese National Health Insurance, 70% of medical costs are covered.</p> <p>At the same time, we require all exchange students to purchase Momoyama Inbound insurance (see below), that works alongside the mandatory National Health Insurance to provide 100% coverage*.</p> <p>Please note that <u>without this additional insurance policy, students CANNOT register in any courses.</u></p> <p>■ Momoyama Inbound insurance PREMIUM *The price and coverage are subject to change. ***Selection is required.**

【Purpose and Contents of the program】

- Participants will work on a project to learn how to encourage more Momoyama students to visit the Kuboso Memorial Museum and will make a proposal to the museum staff.
- Participants will take part in pre-learning sessions and visit the Kuboso Memorial Museum. They will also engage in comprehensive research activities, such as conducting interview surveys with the museum staff, conducting surveys and interviews with the Momoyama students and analyzing the collected data under the guidance of a faculty member.
- This programme aims to enhance not only cross-cultural communication skills, but also intercultural teamwork skills, by bringing together students from diverse cultural and academic backgrounds to work together as a team.

Please join this project to learn together with a museum that houses a large collection of artworks, including Asian art and Western modern art.
